

**JUSTIFICATION AND APPROVAL FOR OTHER THAN FULL AND OPEN  
COMPETITION (OVERSEAS CONTRACTING ACTIVITIES)**

1. I recommend that U.S. Consulate General Karachi use other than full and open competition for the acquisition of Petrol and Diesel for NCC and Frere Spaces using PR10604209 - KHI-Motor Pool: Fuel for Advance Months, PR10624257 - KHI-FAC: Diesel of Generators for NCC & Frere. The estimated cost is **\$24,000.00**

**2. Nature and/or description of the action being approved.**

The approval is to support the acquisition on petrol/diesel using a privately owned corporation vendor (AMAC Pakistan – Asim Mohammad Ali Charolia).

**3. A description of the supplies or services required to meet the agency's needs.**

To avoid fuel crises in absence of large commercial company that have denied fuel supply for over a month.

**4. An identification of the statutory authority permitting other than full and open competition.**

As per FAR 48 CFR 6.302-1(b)(2)) when the supplies and services required by the agency are available from only one or a limited number of responsible sources, and no other type of supplies or services will satisfy agency requirements, full and open competition need not to be provided for.

**5. A demonstration that the proposed contractor's unique qualifications or the nature of the acquisition requires use of the authority cited (for sole source acquisitions; also required for unusual and compelling urgency where more than one offer will not be solicited).**

AMAC has over a decade long experience of supplying fuel to Embassy/Consulate construction contractors at US Mission Pakistan on credit off the market and instantly where large commercial companies deny service.

**6. A description of efforts made to ensure that offers are solicited from as many potential sources as is practicable. The description should include whether a FedBizOpps notice was or will be publicized, as required by FAR 5.2, and if not, which exception under FAR 5.202 applies (e.g., blanket waiver provided in DOSAR 605.202-70).**

DOSAR 605.202-70: The requirement for advance notices in the Government-wide point of entry (GPE) for the Department's foreign acquisitions awarded by overseas contracting activities is waived, as described in U.S. Department of State Federal Business Opportunities Determination of Findings dated August 5, 2016. There are no known U.S. firms or firms with U.S. affiliations in local residence capable of supplying the required supplies or services.

- 7. The Contracting Officer has determined that the anticipated cost to the Government is fair and reasonable.**

No other local companies agree to the credit and Net-30 payment terms set under Federal Financial Regulations due to frequent changes in cost of fuel by OGRA.
